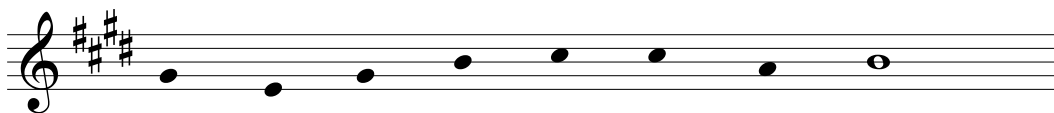


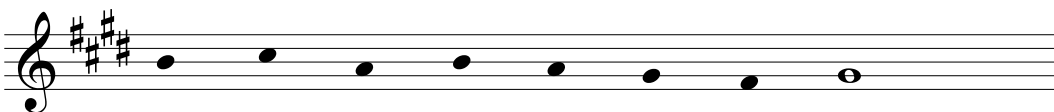

Sarum Plainsong, Mode IV

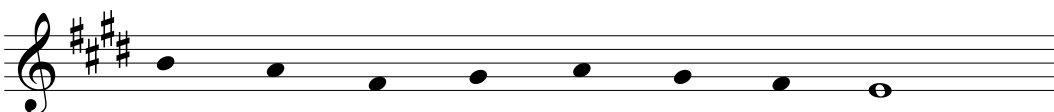
Latin hymn, Ninth Century
